Ada opened in 2016 in Tottenham Hale with the mission to educate and empower the next generation of diverse digital talent. The College now educates a diverse cohort of 500 students and apprentices working with a wide range of industry partners such as Deloitte, IBM, Salesforce, King Games and Bank of America to bring its curriculum to life. The College has recently launched a pilot programme in Greater Manchester. The College regularly achieves the highest grades in the country for its computing qualifications.

Prior to Ada, Mark was a member of the inaugural cohort of Teach First in 2003. He has subsequently worked for Lloyds Banking group in the UK and South Africa, and helped establish a school in Uganda. He graduated from Harvard in 2011 with an interdisciplinary Masters in Education before joining The Future Leaders Trust, an education leadership charity as their Director of Impact.


